The client is a public sector organization responsible for collecting direct taxes and administering the income tax law and other direct tax statutes for the Government.



CHALLENGES

The client lacked a mechanism to question the taxpayer about non-disclosure of income, i.e. the cases where the income declared by the taxpayer did not match Form 26AS.




SOLUTIONS
